Dear Mr. and Mrs. Burr:


I am pleased to write that the decision of the Admissions Committee is to offer Nickie a place in the School this fall. This admission assumes, of course, the satisfactory completion of the present school year.

It was the suggestion of the Admissions Committee that I discuss with you at greater length the possibility of Third Form entrance as opposed to Fourth. Nickie is a boy of considerable academic ability. Further, his work at the Fox Lane School has been strong. He has not, however, had as broad a program in some subjects as he would be receiving at our 9th grade level. I am thinking particularly of Latin and algebra. I was very impressed with him during our meeting of January 29th, particularly with the extent of his reading and what he has gained from those books. While his popularity at his present grade level among his contemporaries suggests that he would have little difficulty in that area on entering our Fourth Form, the same would apply should he enter our Third.

In any event, we would like to have him at the School this September. It may be that you will want to write me concerning the matter of Form, asking further questions.

It will be of the utmost help to the Admissions Committee to hear from you as soon as you have decided definitely whether or not you wish to accept this place. We naturally hope that you will choose to send Nickie to us.

Boys should report to the Rector in the Schoolhouse between 5:30 and 6:30 p. m.

If they are traveling by way of Boston, they may take one of the buses, which are being provided by the School, from South Station between 2:40 and 4:00 p. m., or the train from North Station at 12:30. Boys are asked not to take the 4:20 p. m. train since the railroad does not provide extra cars.

### **Lateness**

Any boy who will not be able to return on time should notify the Rector *by telegram or telephone*.

### **Responsibility**

The responsibility for returning on time rests with the boy or his family, not with the airline or railroad. Plans should be made which do not rely on close connections or on plane flights in uncertain weather.

### **Train Travel**

School rules will be in effect on trains and buses from Boston. We urge parents furthermore to advise their sons with some particularity as to smoking and drinking on trains that bring them to Boston, and in Boston itself during their stopover between trains. The School takes a serious view of any evidence of lack of control in these respects, either when boys are returning from vacations or have been away from the School for any other reason.
